



SPOTLIGHT ON AMERICA'S 250TH



On Sunday, March 8th retired Newsday reporter and historian Bill Bleyer gave a compelling presentation about George Washington's Culper Spy Ring.

Bleyer detailed the important role played by Long Island patriots during the Revolution and also debunked a lot of misinformation that has circulated about those patriot spies. Many of the legends that have been handed down are not always based in truth but make for good stories. Bleyer set the record straight on all accounts.

On Saturday, March 21st, celebrating both America's 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence and Women's History Month, historian and professor emeritus at Hofstra University Natalie Naylor provided rare insight into the role of Long Island women during the Revolutionary War during her presentation entitled "Remembering the Ladies."

While not usually on the front lines wielding a musket, Ms. Naylor provided ample proof that Patriot women played a crucial and largely unsung role in America's fight for independence. By telling their stories of domestic courage, Ms. Naylor illustrated that not all revolutions are fought on the battlefield.


